Take Aways:

- As the people of God, we must be aware that we are still liable to idolatry and falling short of God's glory.
- We must also be aware that sometimes sermons with a hard edge are necessary in order to break up the hardened fallow ground of the human heart.
- This type of preaching is preparatory to the preaching of the Gospel.

Baptist Catechism "On the Lord's Prayer"

Question 117: What do we pray for in the sixth petition?

Answer: In the sixth petition, which is, "And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil," we pray that God would either keep us from being tempted to sin, or support and deliver us when we are tempted. Scripture: Matthew 6:13; 26:41; Psalm 19:13; 1 Corinthians 10:13; John 17:15.

Question 118: What does the conclusion of the Lord's Prayer teach us?

Answer: The conclusion of the Lord's Prayer, which is, "For Thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, forever, Amen," teaches us to take our encouragement in prayer from God only, and in our prayers to praise him, ascribing kingdom, power, and glory to him; and in testimony of our desire, and assurance to be heard, we say AMEN.
